Additional Local Rules

1. Out of Bounds (Rule 27)

- A ball is out of bounds if it comes to rest:
- Beyond any boundary wall or fence.
 - Beyond the line of white posts to the rear of holes 5, 9, 10, 11, 14, 16 and 18.
 - Beyond the line of white posts to the right of hole 8 which defines the Par 3 Course.
 - Beyond the white posts and fence that define the driving range to the left of holes 10 and 18.
 - Beyond the white posts to the right of the lake on holes 17 and 18.

2. Water Hazards (Rule 26-1)

Water hazards are defined by yellow posts and lateral water hazards are defined by red posts.

Dropping Zone

For a ball coming to rest in the water hazard on hole 2, as an additional option to Rule 26-1, the player may proceed to the dropping zone provided, under penalty of one stroke.

3. Immovable Obstructions (Rule 24-2)

- All artificially surfaced cart paths.
- All windbreak fencing (green cloth fences).
- Drip feed irrigation lines
– Note: Relief is only available for interference to the lie of ball or area of intended swing, NOT stance.
- Floodlight poles – Note: Relief is only available for physical interference to

the lie of ball, area of intended swing and stance, NOT intervention on the line of play.

- All gravel areas

4. Movable Obstructions

Stones in bunkers are to be regarded as movable obstructions.

5. Integral Parts of the Course

All desert areas and maintenance tracks. All bunding around deer grass, shrubs and palm trees.

6. Environmentally sensitive area (Rule 25-1)

The BAPCO pipe lines that run parallel to holes 8, 11, 12, 14, 15 and 17 are to be treated as an environmentally sensitive area. This area is defined by white posts with green tips. Players are entitled to a free lift and drop one club-length from the nearest point of relief no nearer the hole.

7. Doubt as to Procedure (Rule 3-3)

Any player that has doubt as to procedure may invoke Rule 3-3 (two-ball rule) if a Club Official is not immediately available. He should first state which ball he wishes to score with and must report the facts to the Committee before returning his scorecard.

8. Distance Measuring Devices

For all play on the Championship and Wee Monty courses, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only.
